End Violence Against Women (EVAW) International is a small non-profit organization providing effective, victim centered, multi-disciplinary training and expert consultation regarding crimes of sexual assault and domestic violence. As the Director of Research, my duties include: developing grant proposals; conducting original research; providing various forms of information and technical assistance to researchers, practitioners, and policymakers; and facilitating training workshops for multidisciplinary audiences of professionals within such diverse fields as law enforcement, victim advocacy, health care, prosecution, and related disciplines.

Current activities of EVAW International focus on two major grant initiatives. First, with federal funding from the Office on Violence Against Women (a division of the U.S. Department of Justice), we have launched an On-Line Training Institute for practitioners on the topic of criminal justice and coordinated community response to crimes of non-stranger sexual assault. I serve as the primary author for training content and also lead the development of curriculum elements such as review exercises, test questions, practical applications, and other interactive opportunities for practice.

The second major grant initiative is known as the Making a Difference (MAD) Project, and it has been funded by the William H. Donner Foundation in several different phases since 2003. During the first phase of funding, EVAW International hosted a national conference in order to promote an integrated criminal justice and community response to sexual violence. Conference scholarships were awarded to applicant teams from eight U.S. communities, with each community team including eight professionals from a variety of disciplines who respond to the needs of sexual assault victims. In the second and third phases of grant funding, EVAW International provided various forms of technical assistance to the eight communities, including a 2-day training conference. My primary role was to guide participants in collecting data on all the sexual assault cases they handle. So far, information has been recorded on over 12,000 sexual assault cases in the eight communities, and the analysis of this data will provide an unprecedented view of the patterns of processing, attrition, and outcomes of sexual assault cases within the criminal justice system and community response.

I also served as Project Director on a grant awarded by the Violence Against Women Office (a division of the U.S. Department of Justice, now known as the Office on Violence Against Women). The purpose of this grant was to develop a training curriculum for law enforcement professionals in sexual assault investigation, with particular emphasis on cases involving known offenders (i.e., non-strangers). After completing the development of the curriculum, I then hosted two national "train-the-trainer" workshops to certify individuals from around the country who could implement the program in their state or region. Responsibilities also included administering a budget of over \$280,000 and completing all federal reporting requirements.
